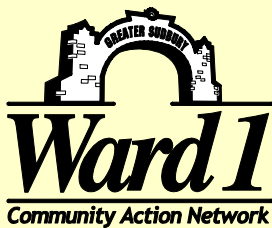

Support from Weston Bakery, the CPR and especially the City of Greater Sudbury has promoted the Lorne St. enhancement in a wonderful way. We continue to clean and prune the CPR property and we will arrange another work party there during the Annual Clean-up in May, 2009.

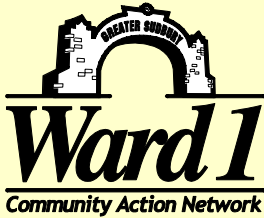
The real exciting news is the large grant we have received from the City to build a Berm-Green Zone along Lorne St. on the Weston Property. The Berm will be grassed this year, and planted with grass bushes and trees. You will hear much more about this as the project develops. We have an annual financial commitment to this project and will be approaching our business and corporate citizens in the Ward for help.

Traffic Calming continues to be a hot topic. The committee continues to work with the city on the Copper St. problems and have begun to expand their focus to include Southview Drive.

We have adopted two new initiatives for 2009: Senior affordable housing and bussing in the Moonglo subdivision. Expect to hear more about these at the Annual Meeting.

If you would like to be involved in any of these projects and please let us know. Someone will be happy to get back to you. The executive meets the first Monday of each month at 7:30 in the Delki Dozzi club house. These are open meetings and you are welcome to attend. We look forward to hearing from you and working with you to improve our Ward.

### Message from Councillor Joe Cimino

I can not wait for Spring!! This has been a long and snowy winter, and like the majority of people in the ward, I am looking forward to warmer temperatures and greener landscapes. I am also anxious for the arrival of the 2009 Spring-Summer season because the two years of hard work put forward by your Community Action Network in planning and forging partnerships will result in tangibles for the community.

I was able, as your Councillor, to secure \$75,000 during the City budget process to initiate our re-greening of Lorne Street along Weston Bakery. Tom Murphy and Paul Labelle of the CAN executive made a compelling presentation to City Council asking the City to become a partner in this long-awaited initiative. Soon, a grass berm and trees will replace this gravel unsightly portion of Lorne. Other partners have been engaged by the CAN to assist in our efforts to beautify the area. We met with representatives from the Canada Pacific Railroad who have plans to aesthetically improve their property from Martindale to Regent. Your CAN, twice picked up rubbish with volunteers along this same stretch, and will also continue to promote the development of the natural vegetation along these tracks. I have ordered through the City four more planters to add to the three on Lorne St., as mandated by the CAN's strategic plans for the Lorne St. corridor.

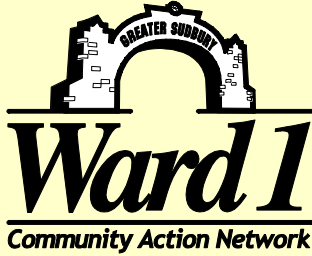
This Spring will also see a ribbon cutting event at a new playground on Travers Street in the West-end. Cindy Severinac, a resident of the area, brought her vision of this parkette to our very first CAN meeting, and with persistence and much support from the community, it has been erected.

I should mention also that the Rainbow Routes trail and boardwalk between Robinson Playground and Moonglo subdivision will also be completed this Spring. Thank you to Rainbow Routes for providing this majestic, natural walking linkage between these two great neighborhoods. Mr. Barbadoro of Cranbrook brought this idea forward to me, and I am grateful for that.

The new mini-soccer field at Delki Dozzi Playground will also see lively activity during the 2009 summer sports season.

Lastly, Bouchard and Southview will see a reformation during this upcoming construction season, as traffic calming planned for that area will come to fruition. Your Ward One CAN Traffic Chair John Katerynuk attended each Council meeting that traffic calming was discussed to support this much needed project.

These are just some of the great things we can look forward to this spring/summer in Ward 1.

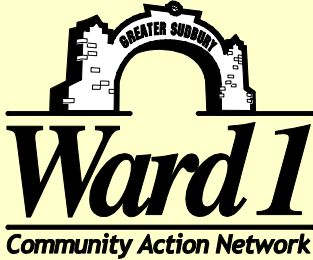

## **WARD 1 CITIZENS ON PATROL**

The Ward 1 Citizens on Patrol Program is composed of dedicated and caring community-minded volunteers, who work together to keep an eye on homes and businesses within the Gatchell, Moonglo, Southview Drive, Lorne Street, Kelly Lake Rd., West End and adjoining areas.

Volunteers undergo a Police background check, interview, and training by the Greater Sudbury Police Service. Once they have fulfilled all requirements, volunteers are provided with a vehicle, uniform, mobile radios, and an Office location from which they are able to conduct mobile observations of their area.

This Ward 1 Group, or what we affectionately call “the Gatchell Group,” has been active within Ward 1 since May 2008, and logged over 1,500 km in five months. Participants are an additional set of eyes and ears for Police and community partners, and provide an invaluable service to the community of Ward 1.

Volunteers for Dispatch positions along with Mobile Observation Team positions are currently needed to expand and sustain this Program in Ward 1.
