Rainbow ROUTES Association is looking for your input on walking and cycling in Greater Sudbury in order to develop a "Sustainable Mobility Plan" for our community.

Sustainable Mobility or Active Transportation involves any form of human-powered transportation: Walking, Running, Cycling, Wheelchair, In-line skating or Skateboarding.

Even if we are using city transit, our trip begins and ends with a walk or a bike ride.

The City of Greater Sudbury has initiated a Sustainable Mobility study to be conducted in 2010 with Rainbow ROUTES Association as the lead agency. This study will assist in fulfilling the City's vision of becoming the most Pedestrian-Friendly City in Ontario by 2015. We are working toward improvements which will make walking and cycling in Greater Sudbury **safe, accessible, efficient and pleasant**.

A significant component of any Sustainable Mobility Plan is public input. Your participation at a community consultation provides you with the **opportunity to have your voice heard** regarding issues surrounding walking

and cycling in our community.
