I am hoping that the residents of Ward 10 have been enjoying our nice winter weather. To date we have had only a few days of very low temperatures and moderate amounts of snow. With any luck this weather will continue until spring. Last summer was extremely busy with a great deal of road construction.

There was a centre turning lane installed on Regent Street between Telstar and Bouchard which should be of great assistance to residents and business owners in that area. Work was completed on Paris Street, a new water main was installed on Maki Drive and the road repaved. In addition, water main renewal and road resurfacing was done on Millwood Crescent. Although this work caused inconvenience, it will make driving safer and ensure the reliable delivery of our drinking water. I thank everyone for their patience.

There have been other accomplishments in the Ward over the past few months. A paved trail for pedestrians and cyclists was constructed down Ramsey Lake Road, which makes it much safer for those running or walking the loop from Lo-Ellen through the University property. A major renovation of the James Jerome Sports Complex at Lily Creek was completed and the Grace Hartman Amphitheatre used by so many residents is being rebuilt. When spring comes, we will have some first rate facilities for sports and recreation. Finally, some upgrades were completed at Oriole Playground and it will be a great resource for all those who use it this summer. I want to end by thanking the Executive of our South End CAN who have worked very hard for all residents. There is always room for more volunteers and I do hope you will join us as the CAN continues to make the South End a wonderful place to live.
